THE SEARCH

Jewish Community Services of South Florida, Inc. (JCS) is seeking a dynamic and well-connected Director of Resource Development and Engagement (RDE) to expand philanthropic support and cultivate deep relationships within Miami's donor community. This is an exciting opportunity for an experienced fundraiser with an established local network of donors, foundations, and business leaders who can accelerate JCS's fundraising efforts by leveraging existing relationships and building new ones. Reporting to the Chief Development Officer (CDO), the Director of RDE will develop and implement strategies to increase revenue across annual giving, major gifts, corporate and foundation giving, and planned giving. This position will play a pivotal role as JCS embarks on an ambitious \$18 million Endowment Campaign to ensure financial sustainability for its programs that serve seniors, Holocaust survivors, families in crisis, and individuals in need throughout South Florida.

The Director of RDE will contribute to the implementation of best practices in moves management and, through direct management and mentorship of frontline staff, will lead the team to increased productivity and strategic portfolio management by providing guidance on cultivation strategies and tracking team progress toward identified goals. The Director of RDE will have the opportunity to build a portfolio and will personally identify, cultivate, solicit, and steward gifts at all levels. Additionally, the Director will oversee the re-design and implementation of annual solicitation plans to grow membership in JCS affinity groups.

The successful candidate will possess a deep understanding of the entire donor cycle and be adept at advising on all aspects of cultivation, solicitation, and stewardship. They will have demonstrated experience working with high-level donors and securing significant philanthropic support. The successful candidate must be able to create a results-oriented work environment that encourages innovation, promotes diversity, and rewards collaboration – both in the division and across the agency – and group achievement. This individual will have exceptional communication, organizational, and relationship-building skills, as well as a strong work ethic and proactive and positive demeanor. Familiarity with the greater Miami-Dade donor community is desired, as is fluency in Spanish.

DIRECTOR OF RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT AND ENGAGEMENT

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

As the second seniormost leader within the division of Resource Development and Engagement, the Director will work closely with the Chief Development Officer to devise strategies and set goals that achieve institutional objectives; implement a robust data-driven platform to measure progress while supporting the professional growth of staff members; and personally manage a select portfolio of high-level potential philanthropic partners and existing philanthropic partners.

Critical to success will be the Director's ability to proactively work to understand and maintain an in-depth knowledge of JCS' programs and staff. The Director will be a collaborative and trusted partner, providing support, counsel, and strategic guidance to senior leaders, volunteers, and staff in preparation for their active participation in the endowment campaign and sustained philanthropic activities. Additionally, the Director will serve as a resource, advocate, and spokesperson for the RDE division and team.

Fundraising and Donor Engagement

- Develop and execute a strategic fundraising plan, leveraging deep connections within Miami's philanthropic, business, and Jewish communities.
- Manage a personal portfolio of up to 150 prospects and donors, targeting high-net-worth individuals, family foundations, and corporate partners.
- Personally cultivate, solicit, secure, and steward major gifts at the five- and six-figure level to support JCS programs and the Endowment Campaign.
- Lead donor engagement initiatives that deepen relationships and expand JCS's reach in Miami-Dade.
- Collaborate with JCS program directors to jointly solicit vendors and partners for sponsorships and philanthropic commitments.

Affinity Groups and Volunteer Engagement

- Grow and manage JCS's affinity groups, providing leadership and strategic direction to increase membership and philanthropic engagement.
- Recruit, onboard, and engage high-level volunteers and key community leaders to champion JCS's mission and fundraising efforts.

Events, Stewardship, and Campaign Leadership

- Oversee the execution of JCS fundraising events, including major donor recognition programs, stewardship initiatives, and signature fundraising campaigns like Milk and Honey and Matzah Mitzvah.
- Ensure a best-practices approach to donor stewardship, delivering high-touch experiences that foster long-term commitment.
- Collaborate with JCS leadership and the Board of Directors to maximize their involvement in fundraising and donor cultivation efforts.

- Exceptional interpersonal and relationship-building skills—a natural connector who thrives in networking, cultivation, and donor engagement.
- Strong strategic planning and program-building expertise, with the ability to craft compelling cases for support and donor proposals.
- Experience leading volunteers, board members, and affinity groups to maximize philanthropic impact.
- Outstanding communication skills, both written and verbal, with the ability to inspire, influence, and engage donors at all levels.
- A passion for JCS's mission and a deep understanding of the needs of the Jewish and broader Miami community.

Singer holds Bachelor of Arts and Master of Public Administration Degrees from the University of Miami.
