THE SEARCH

Long Island University, School of Health Professions, invites applications for two tenure-track positions in the Doctoral Program in Clinical Psychology (Psy.D.). The program is a fully APA-accredited, probationary (under appeal) Doctoral Program that follows the practitioner-scholar model with a unique dual theoretical orientation approach, offering both cognitive-behavioral and psychodynamic approaches. The program is particularly interested in candidates with demonstrated expertise in psychodynamic psychotherapy, dialectical behavioral therapy, and personality assessment.

The successful candidate will actively contribute to department and university committees, develop an extramurally funded research program that engages students, and provide supervision for student practicum experiences. Applicants must hold a PhD or equivalent in psychology and possess a New York State license in psychology or be license-eligible in New York. Candidates should demonstrate a strong record of excellence in teaching and scholarly activity, including peer-reviewed publications and grant writing, and exhibit enthusiasm for advancing the academic, research, and clinical training components of the Psy.D. program. A commitment to free and open discourse as a core value of learning is essential.

The target salary for this role is \$98,001 to \$128,000.

CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY DOCTORAL PROGRAM (PSY.D.)

[Long Island University's Clinical Psychology Doctoral Program \(Psy.D.\)](#) is a rigorous, practitioner-scholar training program that prepares students over five full-time years—culminating in a clinical internship—for professional practice as licensed psychologists. Rooted in a mission to serve traditionally underserved communities, the program uniquely offers both cognitive-behavioral and psychodynamic approaches, ensuring graduates gain flexible, evidence-based therapeutic skills. With a required 115-credit curriculum spanning core psychology courses, ethics, research methods, and focused electives, students begin hands-on clinical training in their second year at the on-campus Psychological Services

Center before advancing into externships at over 50 esteemed inpatient, outpatient, and community mental health settings across the New York–New Jersey region. The program also emphasizes professional development through seminars and structured, empirical dissertation work, which begins in the second year, enabling future psychologists to excel in both clinical practice and scholarship. The Clinical Psychology Psy.D. program is Fully Accredited, on probation (under appeal) by the American Psychological Association. The program aims to resolve the probation issues by the end of November 2026.

ROLE OF THE PSY.D. ASSISTANT/ASSOCIATE TENURE-TRACK PROFESSOR

The School of Health Professions at LIU Post invites qualified applicants for one of two tenure-track faculty positions in the Clinical Psychology Doctoral Program (PsyD). These positions involve teaching and supervising research in PsyD course sequences.

Teaching Responsibilities:

- Teaching responsibilities include delivering doctoral-level coursework in clinical psychology, with a preference for candidates who can teach courses in Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT), Severe and Persistent Mental Illness (SMI), and psychological assessment, specifically the MMPI-3 and the TAT and Rorschach (R-PASS System).

Non-Teaching Responsibilities:

- Additional responsibilities include providing academic advisement, engaging in departmental and university-level activities and events, offering clinical supervision, and mentoring students through the dissertation process.

QUALIFICATIONS AND CHARACTERISTICS

- Candidates must hold a PhD, PsyD, or equivalent in psychology.
- Strong record of excellence in teaching and scholarly activity, including peer-reviewed research and grant writing
- Enthusiasm to continue growing the academic, research, and clinical training aspects of the Psy.D. program
- A commitment to free and open discourse as a core value of learning.
- Licensed/license eligible as a psychologist in NY State.

COMPENSATION AND LOCATION

This is a permanent, full-time position in Brookville, New York with a starting salary range of \$98,001 to \$128,000 and will be commensurate with experience.
